



- In 2000 the Information Technology Services Division in the Department of Administration created the Internet Technology Services Bureau to concentrate on web technology and the Internet
- Industry shift from using the Internet for just information to using it for receiving service
- States were recognizing the value, efficiency and improved customer service potential of providing government services online

- At the recommendation of the then Information Technology Advisory Council, the Department of Administration explored the Self-Funded Portal model:
 - Unique funding model
 - Twelve other states were using the model (Montana became the 13th; today there are 28 states total)
 - The contractor provided the infrastructure (Eliminating a \$2 million EPP request in 2001)
 - Contractor provided the knowledge for online application development

eGovernment in Montana

- The Department of Administration management decided to try the self-funded model
- The idea and model were discussed with the 2001 Legislature in the form of the current "Montana Electronic Government Services Act"

- > 2-17-1101 1105, MCA "Montana Electronic Government Services Act"
 - Establishes the Department of Administration's duties
 - Provides rulemaking authority
 - Establishes the Electronic Government Advisory Council


Council's Duties

- Advise the Department of Administration regarding:
 - eGovernment services and information on the Internet
 - Administration of eGovernment services contract
 - Prioritizing of eGovernment services
 - Assessing convenience fees for eGovernment services
 - Reviewing financial and management reports
 - Preparing reports as requested

Council's Duties

- Advise the Department of Administration regarding:
 - Identifying interagency eGovernment services
 - Acting as a coordination point for eGovernment services
 - Studying, proposing, developing, or coordinating any other activity to further eGovernment services
- 10 eGovernment Services in 2001
- 20 by end of 2002

Membership

- Fourteen members, seven standing members and seven rotating members
- Rotating members serve two-year terms and may be reappointed

The Montana Department of Labor and Industry, Unemployment Insurance Division welcomes you to UI4U.

This service allows you to file your unemployment insurance claim, reactivate your claim, file your biweekly request for payment, request direct deposit of your unemployment benefits, request redetermination or appeal of a decision regarding your claim, update personal information, such as your address, phone number or email address, review information about your claim, or view and print your 1099-G.

You will need the following information to file:

- Your Social Security Number
- Your current mailing address
- Your telephone number and/or email address
- © Complete name, address and phone number of all employers you have worked for since 01-01-2011

Direct Deposit:

If you wish to have your benefits deposited directly to your bank account, you will need your account number and bank routing number for the account you want your benefits deposited in.

If you are an ex-military member:

A copy of your DD214, Member 4 will need to be mailed to our office. Note: You may file an unemployment claim after your discharge date shown on your DD214, Member 4.

If you were a Federal employee:

Your SF8 or SF50 may assist you in filing your claim.

If you obtain work through a union:

The name and local number of your union hall

If you are not a U.S. Citizen:

Alien registration card number and expiration date




