RE: June 27 meeting agenda and materials

The Law and Justice Interim Committee will meet on Friday, June 27 in Room 102 of the Capitol. The meeting starts at **8 a.m.** This is a one-day meeting. LJIC will not meet on Thursday, June 26, as originally scheduled.

The meeting agenda is enclosed in this packet along with the meeting materials. Please bring this packet with you to the meeting. The materials are roughly organized in agenda order and most can be found online at www.leg.mt.gov/ljic. I will send additional materials to you via email and have copies of late-arriving materials at the meeting.

Materials include:

- the final report of the Re-Entry Task Force established by HB 68 (2013), which was a LJIC bill carried by Representative MacDonald;
- the current licensing instrument used by the Department of Corrections (DOC) when auditing the Crossroads Correctional Center (CCA);
- a Legislative Audit Division memo regarding CCA contract assessment work it performed in late 2011;
- a 2011 written review by DOC of the inmate welfare account at CCA;
- collaborative law background materials;
- a memo explaining how and why interim committees authorize agency legislative proposals for the 2015 session;
- copies of the agency proposals that were available at the time of the mailing (additional proposals will be emailed to you or distributed at the meeting);
- an administrative rule review memo from staff;
- a report and table of councils and commissions and required reports that the LJIC must review each interim;
- bill draft language for possible SJ 3 and SJ 22 committee bills; and
- public comments on your work.

In addition, you received copies of the summary minute logs from your April meeting (the pink papers). Because the audio files are the official minutes, you do not need to approve the summary logs. Although not related to an item on the agenda, documents from a recent decision by the Board of Pardons and parole related to Barry Beach are also included in the mailing for you.
