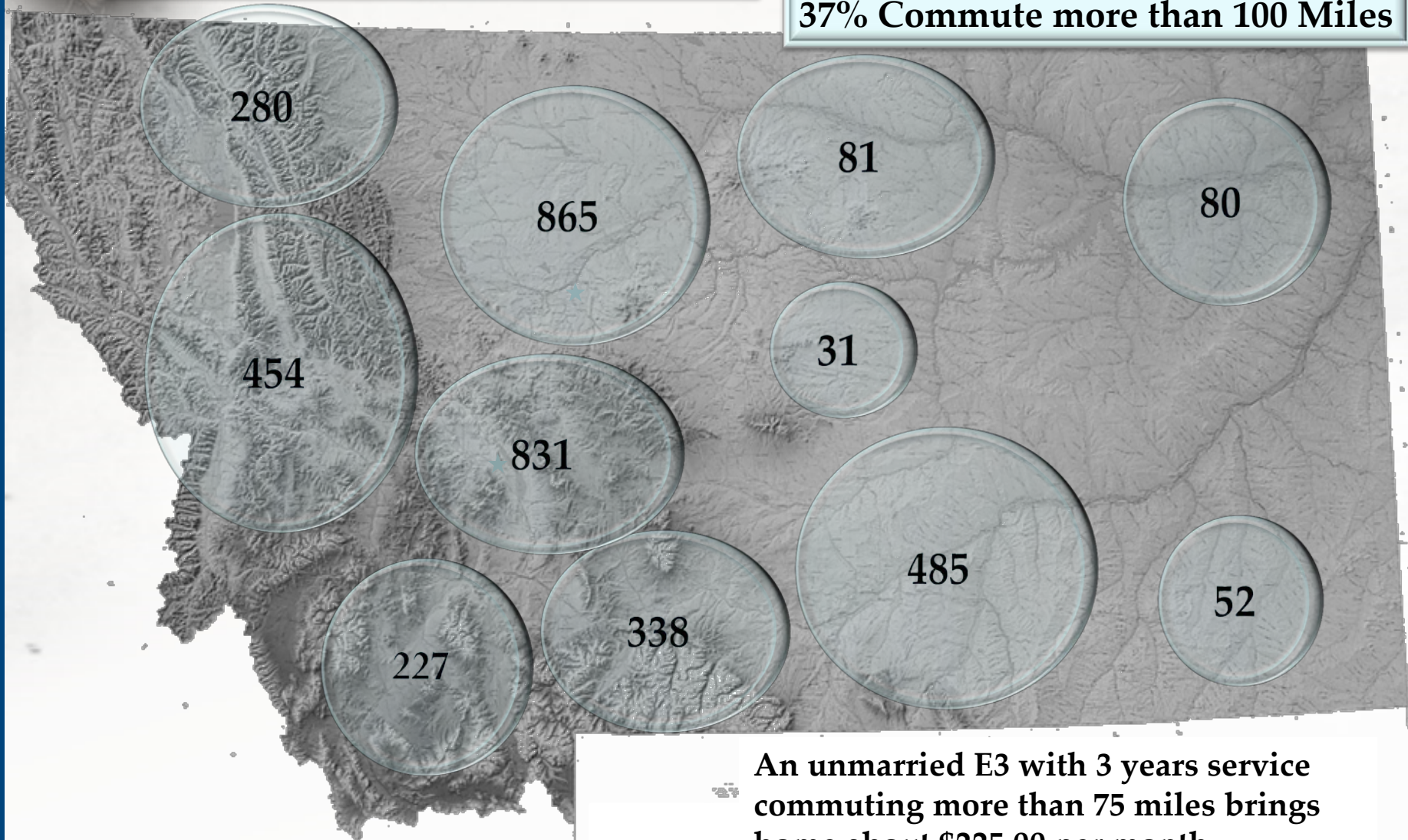

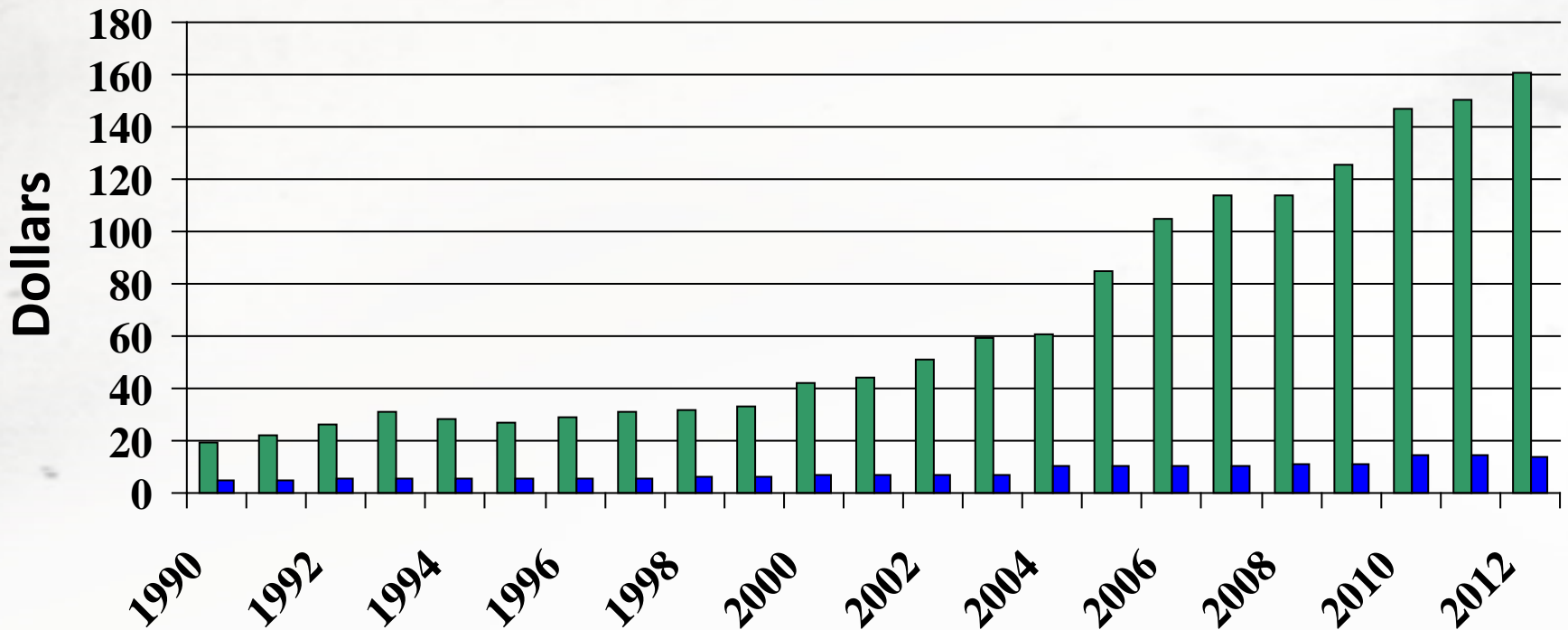
Economic Impact of Agency Work Effort

For every \$1 of state General/Special Fund invested into the Veterans Services Program, agency staff attained \$114 in federal VA monetary compensation to Montana veterans.
