**How to Claim Abandoned Property held by the State of Montana
Montana Department of Revenue - Citizen Services and Resource Management**

If you think you might have unclaimed property in Montana, you have two options.

- 1 Call the Montana Department of Revenue toll-free at (866) 859-2254 (in Helena 444-6900).
 - Ask us to do a free search under your name.
 - If we find a property, we will mail you the proper claim forms and instructions.

- 2 You can do a free search by visiting missingmoney.com
 - This website will search for property reported to the Department of Revenue in the current year or in prior years.
 - If you find property you can complete a claim form which includes information needed to identify yourself.
 - The website includes instructions for completing the form and mailing the form to the Department of Revenue.

Unclaimed Property

Do we have money for you? Our most recent list of newly reported unclaimed properties will be published in newspapers around Montana this fall. You can [view dates](#) of when this publication will be featured in your local newspaper or do an immediate search of Montana's unclaimed property at [MissingMoney.com](#).

Do you have a lost treasure in Montana?

Have you forgotten about a checking or savings account, an old uncashed check, gift certificate, stock, safe-deposit box, or other similar property? Montana is a custodial state and holds unclaimed property on behalf of the owners. Unclaimed property is reported to Montana when the owner's last known address is in Montana.

The Montana Department of Revenue handles the state's unclaimed property which includes such items as uncashed checks, state refunds, uncashed payroll checks, utility deposits, interest or dividend income, savings and checking accounts, safe-deposit box contents, credit balances, customer overpayments, gift certificates, unidentified remittances and stocks and bonds.

If you believe you may be the owner of unclaimed property, there are two easy ways to conduct a search: do a search online or ask the department to conduct a search for you.

Searching Online



Montana's unclaimed property is listed at [MissingMoney.com](#). This *free* national database helps consumers search for lost assets and unclaimed property. It is an easy-to-use website that updates once a month. Unclaimed property listings from 37 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and Alberta, Canada are available for searches on the site.

Please note: There are other websites that offer assistance with finding unclaimed property. However, many of these sites require a payment before you can discover if you have unclaimed property. Although these sites are legal businesses, it's unnecessary to pay so that you can reclaim your property. [MissingMoney.com](#) is the Department of Revenue's only partner for unclaimed property searches.

Requesting a search

If you want the Department of Revenue to conduct an unclaimed property search for you, please call us toll free at 1-866-359-2254 (in Helena, 444-6900). We will be happy to assist you by doing a search on our system. If you do have property, we will send you a claim form and a checklist of the documents needed to process your claim. Returning the documentation shown on the checklist, along with your signed and notarized claim form, will help us to process your claim quickly.
