

## **Health Promotion Disease Prevention Program**

### **Programs Services and Opportunities to the Fort Peck Reservation**

**School Based Health Clinics** servicing approximately 1500 children from Headstart to Grade 12.

- Medical services provided by Family Nurse Practitioner in Poplar, Frazer, Brockton to services the children and families
- Dental services provided by Dental Hygienist in Poplar, Frazer, Brockton and in the community of Ft. Kipp to services the children and families
- Mental health services provided by Dental Hygienist in Poplar, Frazer, Brockton and in the community of Ft. Kipp to services the children and families

**Health Improvement Program** -Medicaid High Risk Services to patient to improve quality of care, provided by a team consisting of a nurse, clinical assistant under the direction of the Registered Nurse.

Healthy Montana Kids enrollment services, trained HPDP staff assisting eligible clients for health benefits for alternate resources

#### **Personal Care Attendant Program** -Elder Program

Personal Care Attendants providing services to elderly and handicapped who qualify under the State Medicaid program

Elders Make a Difference by assisting the HPDP program with Tribal Values, incorporating into the functions and services at the various events and programs especially the youth,

**Business Office**-Third Party Billing for all health services provided by HPDP professional and licensed staff, also providing billing services to:

- Diabetes Program
- Wrap Around Services
- Personal Care Attendant Program

#### **New Renaissance Chiropractic services**

- Christmas on the reservation providing presents to all students in Head Start to High School as well as elders in the communities
- Children's fun day
- Movie Theatre renovation project

#### **Harvard Medical School/Emergency Medicine Project:**

- Harvard Medical School High School Summer Program offers Fort Peck Reservation High School student to participate in a 3 week educational learning opportunity focusing on a local health issue facing the Native American population that is shared to their

respective reservation with what they have learned and listed opportunities to resolve their demographic health care issue

- Harvard's Emergency Medicine Department at the Brigham Women's Hospital that was successful in receiving federal funding. The funding will coordinate exchanges and services between Harvard Emergency Medicine Department, and Fort Peck HPDP Wellness program with programs from International countries of Palestine and Israel. The involvement will consist of a Global Fellowship Exchange Training program where all parties will learn from one another in the Child and Maternal Health services offered to their respective populations. The goal of this cooperative international professional capacity development is to improve Public Health in resource challenged communities, save lives and promote mutual understanding.
  - As an outcome from this program, the HPDP program is planning for a Women's Health Promotion Conference modeled after the Israel's program which empowers women to take action towards improving their family health in accordance to their needs and socio-cultural background

#### **University of Washington projects:**

- Cancer grant to develop Cancer Resource Guide
- **Colon Cancer Project** prevention project, providing community education and developing resources to the Fort Peck Reservation communities
- Data Warehouse, developing Tribal data collection to better service to address the health disparities that will solely own by the Fort Peck Tribes

  - Research data to elicit community interest in determining and prioritizing health topics for facilitate future research partnerships
  - Tele-nutrition services to assist the communities with proper nutritional diets
