INTRODUCTION TO LRP PROJECT STATUS REPORTS

The Long-Range Planning Subcommittee (LRP) makes project appropriations for most large capital projects. Included are statewide project appropriations for new state buildings, additions, and major maintenance of state buildings and land and facility purchases through the Long-Range Building Program (LRBP) and major information technology (IT) projects for state government, through the Long-Range Information Technology Program (LRITP). During the legislative sessions, members of the LRP subcommittee are informed of the status of projects appropriated in prior biennia, but during the interim legislators are typically only made aware of the status of those projects where concerns and issues are raised. The attached reports serve as a tool to keep the legislature better informed of the status of the capital projects.

INTENT AND GOALS OF REPORTS

The intent of the LRBP and the LRITP project status reports are to inform members of the legislature and other interested parties of the progress, or status, of each of the state capital projects. The reports are designed to be easily updated by state agency personnel. The reports are not meant to be a fully comprehensive report on each project, but are intended to provide a general update of the progress of each project. Both reports are organized to provide the contact name and number of the administering state division should users wish further information.

READING THE REPORTS

The LRBP and LRITP status reports contain projects that were appropriated for the 2009 and 2011 biennia and projects from earlier biennia which have not been completed. The LRBP report does not include certain LRBP projects that are made as statewide appropriations for numerous small projects. Examples of such projects are the biennial appropriations for "Roof Repairs and Replacements" or "Hazardous Materials Abatement". Since these appropriations are spread across numerous projects, it would be difficult to assign milestone ratings to the projects. Additionally, many of the LRBP Fish, Wildlife, and Parks projects, included in HB 5, are not included in the report since many of the appropriations are for programs as opposed to individual projects.

The report is compiled by administering agency/division. For example, in the LRBP report, most of the projects are administered by the Architecture and Engineering Division (A&E) of the Department of Administration. In the grey "administration" box, you will find the name of the administering agency/division along with contact information if the user has further questions. Under the administration box, you will find the projects listed by the agency for which the project is being done. Reading across the table, you will see:

- The project name (as provided in the relevant version of HB 5)
- The biennium for which the project was initially authorized
- The funding type code (see key at bottom of report)
- The total project appropriation (from the relevant version of HB 5)
- A set of milestones (developed with the help of the primary administering agencies/divisions)
- An exceeding budget indicator column
- The estimated completion date
- Any comments related to the projects

An "X" in any specific milestone column means that the project is in the process of completing the milestone. In the case of the LRITP Status Report, the milestones are defined below the key. An "X" in the exceeding budget column generally indicates that additional funding will be required to complete the project. Most often, projects are completed within the budget provided by the legislature. Completion dates are input as a component of the contracted agreement.
