NATURAL GAS UTILITY REGULATION

Background Materials and Research

Topic Summary: Three distribution utilities and two transmission pipeline systems handle more than 99 percent of the natural gas consumed in Montana. The distribution utilities are NWE, MDU, and Energy West, which uses NWE for gas transmission. NWE and the Williston Basin Interstate Pipeline (affiliated with MDU) provide transmission service for in-state consumers and, with a handful of other pipelines, export Montana natural gas. Distribution lines are typically smaller and serve local customers, whereas transmission lines are larger lines that carry gas from production areas to large consumers and the distribution networks of populated areas. NWE is the largest provider of natural gas in Montana, accounting for almost 60 percent of all regulated sales in the state according to annual reports from Montana utilities. NorthWestern Energy serves Montana natural gas customers in 105 communities, and provides gas storage and transmission to other parties. NWE provides natural gas transmission and distribution services to about 194,100 natural gas customers in the western two-thirds of Montana (including the Conoco and Cenex oil refineries in Billings). These customers include residences, commercial businesses, municipalities, state and local governments, and industry. NWE's gas transportation system, both long-distance pipeline transmission and local distribution, lies entirely within Montana.
