Subject: Income Tax Fraud Update

At the last Revenue and Transportation Interim Committee Meeting, the Committee asked the department if we knew how many fraudulent refunds had been processed that were not stopped by the department's fraud program. The Committee also asked if the department was aware of any national standards or percentages that provided any guidance as to what might be an acceptable percentage of fraudulent returns to overall tax returns filed.

Tax Fraud Update

The following table provides the Committee with an update on the fraudulent returns and claims for refunds that have been stopped as of April 25, 2014. The table also includes the number of fraudulent returns that we are aware that have made it passed our fraud program.

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National Standards or Percentages

The department is unaware of any national standards or percentages that would indicate the percent of fraudulent tax returns to overall tax returns filed which is acceptable. The IRS reports that from 2011 through November of 2013 they have stopped 14.6 million suspicious returns and over \$50 billion in fraudulent refunds. Annually the IRS receives 146 million individual income tax returns.
