Dear Fellow Montanans:

This is the third statement of Jonathan Motl, Montana Commissioner of Political Practices, as to the effect of the Order of the United States District Court for the District of Montana ruling that Montana's statutory limits on contributions to candidates are unconstitutional. The limits struck down were enacted by initiative vote of Montanans in 1994. Please see the "previous Commissioner Letters", below, to review the prior two statements.

The Commissioner through this statement and accompanying revised Policy reinstates inflation adjusted 1994 contribution limits for 2016 elections as applied to contributions from individuals and political committees, other than political parties.

III. 2016 Contribution Limits for Political Party Committees

On May 25, 2016 the Court issued its partial stay of its May 17, 2016 Order, thereby restoring existing limits for political party committees for the 2016 elections. Those limits were and are (44.11.227 ARM):
