## **Questions to Staff:**

- (1) Why can't funding the alternative or deciding not to introduce any legislation be interpreted as the Legislature "not approving" the new CC district? Funding an alternative can co-exist with approval of a new CC. The fact that the Leg. chooses to fund another alternative, such as a new College of Technology (COT), by bill or in HB 2 doesn't eliminate the requirement for a decision on approving a new CC district. Section 20-15-309, MCA, as interpreted by the A.G. Opinion implies a final decision or "vote" by the Legislature specifically on the BVCC petition request.
- (2) Why can't PEPB or ELG minutes or the final ELG report stating non-support for CC be evidence that Leg. did not approve BVCC? Section 20-15-309, MCA states "approval" by whole Legislature and not action by a Committee of the Legislature.
- (3) What are PEPB Options Regarding BVCC petition for new CC district?

**Option A:** Recommend to ELG that it *request and sponsor* legislation approving the BVCC district (Committee bill/JR -"By Request of the ELG");

**Option B:** Recommend to ELG that it *request, but not sponsor*, legislation approving the BVCC district (Bill/JR will be drafted, but BVCC must find Sponsor); or

**Option C:** No Recommendation to ELG (BVCC supporters must find a "qualified" Legislator to request and sponsor Bill/JR).
